GUEST SPEAKERS:



FRANK BOVA: As Chief of Community Safety and Protection, Mr. Bova is responsible for the oversight, coordination, and cooperation of the County's safety, justice and consumer-related departments. Frank Bova is a third-generation Cleveland Police Officer, spanning three decades of law enforcement as a Cleveland Police Officer, Chief of Police for Warrensville Heights and Sheriff of Cuyahoga County.



DUANE DESKINS: Before joining the Prosecutor's Office in December 2013 as First Assistant Prosecutor–Chief, Juvenile Justice Division and Director of Juvenile Crime Prevention; Mr. Deskins served as a Federal Prosecutor in the US Attorney's Office for more than 30 years. He currently leads a broad initiative to improve the quality of juvenile justice in Cuyahoga County and to reduce juvenile crime.



EDWARD KRAUSE: Appointed in January 2015 as Director of Regional Collaboration to promote services to municipalities that save money, time, personnel costs and savings to the taxpayer. Mr. Krause's 29 year legal career includes Assistant County Prosecutor in the Criminal Division, working as a private practice trial attorney, and supervising attorney for the Cuyahoga County Mortgage Fraud Task Force.



SHERIFF CLIFFORD PINKNEY: As a 25 year veteran of the Cuyahoga County Sheriff Department, Sheriff Pinkney worked his way through the ranks as Detective, Sergeant, Lieutenant, and Chief Deputy Sheriff before being appointed Sheriff of Cuyahoga County in March 2015. He is the recipient of countless awards and commendations from the F.B.I. and the U.S. Marshall Service, and is a member of numerous associations.
